MINUTES

Attorney General Chris Carr called to order the third meeting of the Court Reform Council at 9:30 a.m. on Monday, September 25, 2017.

After conducting round-table interviews of committee members, Attorney General Carr called for introductions by members of the public. Attorney General Carr then called for approval of the minutes from the second meeting.

The minutes from the second meeting were approved.

Attorney General Carr then reminded the Council of the December 1, 2017 deadline for recommendations to Governor Nathan Deal.

To ensure the timeliness of the Council's recommendations, Attorney General Carr proposed a schedule, noting that this meeting marks the last full meeting before the Council will vote on recommendations.

Attorney General Carr proposed that subcommittees should have as many meetings as needed to have a final draft of recommendations submitted to the full Council for review by October 25, 2017.

Attorney General Carr asked the Council if the plan was aggregable. The Council approved.

Before concluding, Attorney General Carr asked each subcommittee chair to provide a brief update on where the subcommittee is in providing final recommendations to the Council for consideration.

Judge Malihi reported that the Administrative Procedure Act Subcommittee finalized their recommendations and is awaiting feedback from its members.

Attorney General Carr reported that the Sovereign Immunity Subcommittee is in the process of drafting recommendations for circulation amongst its members.

David Werner and Carey Miller reported that the Statewide Business Court Subcommittee is in the process of developing recommendations to be approved by its members.

Attorney General Carr reported that the Sovereign Immunity Subcommittee is in the process of drafting a report that will be ready for distribution amongst its members the following week.

Attorney General Carr called for public comment.
