- WHEREAS: Through hard work, ingenuity, and courage, older Georgians have inspired subsequent generations, provided a foundation for the continued progression of local communities, and helped to safeguard the freedoms we enjoy today; and
- WHEREAS: Georgia's older residents remain active in their communities and civic life by participating in volunteer and mentorship opportunities, engaging in the arts and humanities, and pursuing new areas of interest. Recognizing such successes among community elders encourages their ongoing participation and celebrates their accomplishments; and
- WHEREAS: By promoting home-based and community-based services for more independent living and by expanding opportunities for continued work and learning, we can enrich the lives of older Georgians and help to ensure their overall well-being; and
- WHEREAS: Older Americans Month provides an opportunity to recognize and thank the members of this devoted and active population for all that they have contributed and will continue to contribute to Georgia; now
- THEREFORE: I, NATHAN DEAL, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim May 2018 as OLDER AMERICANS MONTH in Georgia.
